Year 6 Visit to Oxford

What a great day! Last week, the children took a trip to Oxford to visit the Natural History Museum, to learn about evolution and the Pitt Rivers Museum, to find out what it would be like living in a cold climate like the Arctic Circle (linked to our topic on Iceland).

At the Natural History Museum, the children took part in an Evolve, Adapt and Survive workshop with resident expert, Guy. After exploring how Alfred Russel Wallace and Charles Darwin came up with their theory on how evolution occurs, the children looked at driving forces of natural selection and variation. Using a range of specimens from moths to crocodile skin to polar bear feet, the children heard all about how all terrestrial vertebrates evolved from a fishy, four-finned ancestor that crawled onto land some 375 million years ago. Year 6 then had time to explore all the different artefacts at the museum and learn more about different rocks, viruses and animals.









At the Pitt Rivers Museum, the children took part in a workshop about the Inuits and what life was like for people living in the Arctic Circle about 100 years ago. They looked at different artefacts that were generally all made from the poor seals (!), including canoes (skins wrapped around a wooden base), clothing (gutted and cleaned seal intestines!) and weapons.





It was a fabulous day for all the children and staff. Thank you to all those who helped make this day so special.

Snow

I thought that I should send information out to parents and carers around school closures in case of snow. We will always endeavour to keep the school open, as closing the school presents problems for working parents, and we have a statutory responsibility to provide an education for the children during school hours. I also try to not have the school open for just half a day, or allow a late arrival at school, as this poses operational problems and again is a hassle for parents and carers if they have to do a ten o'clock drop-off or one o'clock pick-up.

However, we also have to staff the school adequately to ensure the safety and well-being of the children, and most of our staff live beyond the boundaries of Kings Worthy, whereas most of the children live within walking distance.

When deciding whether or not to close the school, I have to consider the journey that staff will take in terms of distance and safety, whether kitchen staff are able to get into school to feed the children and also take into account the weather forecast for the day. If I do decide to close the school, this will appear on the 'announcement' banner on the school website as early as possible on the day of closure. It will also be on the Hampshire County Council page for school closures, and BBC Radio Solent picks up from this to announce closures. We would endeavour to email parents, but it is likely that email traffic will be high if multiple schools are doing this, and it may be that the email communication is slow. If the school remains open, then we will run as a normal school day and any absence will be unauthorised.


School will be closed to all pupils.
